Guidelines for Form OSHR 30 (Revised December 2019)

To All Employers,

The Occupational Safety and Health Regulations 2009 requires every employer to submit an annual report of the number of accidents, dangerous occurrences and injuries that occurred at the workplace during the calendar year of January to December.

As an employer you will be responsible for ensuring that the report is submitted as required no later than March 1st of each year. Please complete Form OSHR 30 even if no incidents have occurred by placing zero in the boxes.

For clarification, see definitions below.

Definitions:

Accident:	An occurrence at any employer's place of employment or in the course of employment that causes death or serious injury to any person.
Dangerous Occurrence	An occurrence or situation at a place of employment or in the course of employment that has the potential to cause death or serious injury to any person.
Minor Injury	Any injury, disease or illness incurred by any person at an employer's place of employment, or in the course of employment that requires medical treatment (other than first aid)but is not a serious injury.
Serious Injury	 An occupational disease, illness or injury that is incurred by any person at an employer's place of employment or in the course of employment that: prevents the person from reporting for work or from effectively performing all duties connected with their regular work on any day subsequent to the day on which the injury, disease or illness was incurred; results in the loss by the person of a body member or part of it or in the complete loss of the usefulness of a body member or part of it; or results in the permanent impairment of a body function of the person.
Musculoskeletal Injury or Disorder	Any injury, damage or disorder of the muscles, joints or other tissues in the upper or lower limbs or the back. These injuries can result from overuse and develop over time. Work activities that are frequent and repetitive or activities with awkward postures cause these disorders.
Workplace Violence &/or Harassment	Any act in which a person is abused, threatened, intimidated, or assaulted in his or her employment. Examples of workplace violence and harassment include: Threatening behavior; verbal or written threats; verbal abuse or physical attacks.

The Occupational Safety & Health Act provides the overarching health and safety requirements. However, the Occupational Safety & Health Regulations 2009 give more detailed g8idance on what is required in specific workplace scenarios.
