### CONDITIONS OF A LICENCE TO BREED DOGS

A **Breeder's Licence** is required by any person who breeds a dog or keeps a pregnant dog, whether or not such breeding is/was intentional. An animal warden will inspect the premises where the puppies will be raised, and make a recommendation to approve or deny the application based on his/her findings. Once an application has received approval-in-principle, the female dog may be mated. Once the pregnancy has been confirmed, the breeder must pay the appropriate licence fee **BEFORE** the puppies are born.

Any person, who has been granted an approval-in-principle or a licence to breed a dog, must adhere to all of the following conditions, and any additional conditions that were imposed on his/her specific licence. Failure to do so could result in the cancellation of your Breeder's Licence, and you will be liable in Court for any breaches of the conditions attached to your licence and/or any breaches committed against the Dogs Act 2008.

- 1. The breeder must apply to the Animal Control Section of this Department for a Breeder's Licence **before** the female dog has been mated.
- 2. Any building or structure relevant to this application must already have the approval of the Department of Planning. Seek advice from the Department of Planning (5<sup>th</sup> Floor, Dame Lois Browne-Evans Building, 58 Court Street, Hamilton, tel. 297-7756) for any questions you may have concerning planning issues.
- 3. An officer will inspect the premises to ensure that the area used for whelping and raising the puppies is adequate in terms of safety, sanitation, protection from rain, sun and wind, control of noise and odour, and that the animals can be properly confined. The officer will report his findings to the Director.
- 4. If the premise is inadequate, you will be advised on how it must be improved. If the premise is adequate, and the applicant and premise have not been the subject of previous complaints, the inspecting officer will give **approval-in-principle**, which is valid for **six months** after the inspection date. The bitch may be mated thereafter. A **Breeder's Licence** will be issued when you report a confirmed pregnancy to the Department and pay the appropriate fee. No licence will be issued until payment has been received. **Note:** The approval-in-principle is <u>not</u> a Breeder's Licence, and a Breeder's Licence must be obtained **before** the puppies are born.
- 5. A Breeder's Licence is valid only for one specific dog (which will be identified by licence and microchip) and one specific premise. The licence will be valid for a maximum of 90 days beyond anticipated whelping date.
- 6. The breeder must report the birth of the litter to the Department.
- 7. The breeder must be able to identify each puppy individually and with certainty, either by gender, coat markings, coloured collars, non-toxic fingernail polish, some other technique or combination thereof.
- 8. Inherent in the Breeder's Licence is temporary permission to keep additional dogs on the premises. This permission pertains only to the puppies born of this licensed litter.
- 9. **For Restricted Breeds:** Each recipient of a restricted breed must be approved **prior** to receiving a puppy. The breeder should ensure that each recipient submits an application to acquire a restricted breed dog, and is approved before completing a sale/transfer of ownership. Ensuring there are capable recipients of the puppies will affect this application.
- 10. The breeder must have each puppy **identified by licence and microchip** before distribution to the new owner or by age ten weeks, whichever comes first. The licences shall be transferred to the new owners of the puppies.
- 11. The breeder will be issued dog licence registration forms on which he/she must record the required details about the new keepers of the puppies. New keepers must be aged 18 years or above. The dog licence registration forms must be returned to the Department within two weeks after:
  - a). the puppies turn age four months; or
  - b). all puppies have left the breeder's premises, whichever occurs first.

Any rare, exotic or uncommon breed may also be refused entry or permission to breed despite its absence from the above lists. You may contact us if you have a dog of a breed that may be perceived as dangerous.

#### **Prohibited**

• Dogs of these breeds may not be imported, bred or used for breeding.

#### Restricted

- Dogs of these breeds may be imported under permit once the conditions for importation and keeping have been fulfilled by the importer.
- New acquisitions of these dogs require pre-approval.
- Dogs of these breeds may be bred only following receipt of a Breeder's permit.
