# Issue Brief: Long Term Care Action Plan

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## ABOUT THE PLAN

A one-year **Long Term Care Action Plan** was developed to address Goal 7 of **The Bermuda Health Strategy 2014**-**2019** .The Plan provides 13 key objectives to help achieve the Goal of coordinated long term care services (see Page 2). The Plan was put into place in January 2017 and a Steering Committee, which meets bi-monthly, was created to oversee the roll-out.

# ACHIEVEMENTS TO DATE:

- •Formalized Senior Abuse Policy, Procedures and created protocols with police and the hospital.
- Palliative care benefit added to the basic insurance product to increase access to in-home hospice care.
- •FutureCare & HIP's Personal Home Care Benefit registration streamlined and user-friendly Guide created.
- Hospital long stay rates redesigned for cost control
- •LTC Education & Training website page created for families & professionals
- •7 care homes enrolled in Bermuda National Standards Committee (BNSC) accreditation programme
- Ongoing stakeholder consultations for changes to care home legislation.
- •Data collected on government LTC spending to develop financing options for 3-5 year strategy
- •Intellectual disabilities visioning workshop held to contribute to the LTC 3 to 5 year strategy.

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
