

COVID-19TravellerQuarantine Instructions

Please review the quarantine instructions below that you must follow while you are in Bermuda as per the Quarantine Act 2017 s.11 and the Quarantine (COVID-19)(No.3) Order 2020, failure to comply may result in a fine of \$25,000 and/or imprisonment for up to 6 months.

Your Instructions Today

You refused a COVID-19 Test on arrival

(Adults and children 10 and older)*

Quarantine at home or accommodation until you receive a negative result from your day-14 test. Only leave home/accommodation for testing.

Your arrival day is considered day 0

*Children 9 and younger must quarantine with parent or quardian

During your Stay

Standard precautions you must take Do not leave your home or Keep physical distance and wash Wear a quarantine bracelet home or accommodation your hands regularly Monitor your health daily Log your temperature on Take your temperature twice Record any symptoms daily for 14 days overleaf If you temperature is over 100.4F or 38C please email: covid19surv@gov.bm Test on day 14 on: at: A reminder email will be sent 24 hours before your test

If you refuse a test on day 14, you must quarantine an additional 14 days

Frequently Asked Questions


- Your PCR COVID-19 testing appointment on day 14 is booked upon arrival.

Positive COVID-19 Result

If a traveller becomes COVID-19 positive, is a close contact of a positive person, is symptomatic, or if a traveller is clinically diagnosed at any point, they will be isolated at their accommodation for at least 14 days.
