<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Negative COVID-19 PCR test result taken within 5 days of arrival in Bermuda from last port. The day of the test, is day 0. 2. Must be performed by an accredited laboratory. 3. Test result must show traveller's full name, email or home address, date of birth, date of the test, test result, and the name and contact of the laboratory. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Complete the TA application up to 5 days before arrival in Bermuda from last port. One for each traveller. 2. Upload a negative PCR COVID-19 test result taken no more than 5 days before arrival.* 3. Complete personal and health information. 4. For travellers with a pre-departure test, the fee is \$75 for 10-year-olds and up, \$30 for 9-years-old and younger. For resident travellers without a pre-arrival test. Only Visa and Mastercard are accepted. 5. Sign the TA agreeing to comply with all quarantine and testing requirements. Parents must consent for testing for children 10 to 17-years-old. Without consent, the child (ren) must quarantine for 14-days. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Captains must send the Travel Authorisation and negative COVID-19 PCR test result for all mariners to: dutyofficer@marops.bm and porthealth@gov.bm 2. Captains must also follow the normal procedures to apply for transit, cruising or charter permits (Passenger Ships and Other Vessels Act 1972). 3. Bring a thermometer and masks. 4. Have health insurance to cover illness outside of your jurisdiction including COVID-19 related illness. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Clear customs in Bermuda and have assessment by Port Health at Yacht Reporting Centre in St. George's.** 2. Mariners must wear a face mask and maintain six feet distance during clearance process. 3. After clearance, yachts must proceed to anchor for quarantine, flying the yellow Quarantine flag. 4. During Quarantine, all commerce must be contactless and delivered to the vessel. 5. Mariners may berth or anchor around Bermuda with permission from Bermuda Radio and respective marina/club. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Mariners with a pre-arrival COVID-19 PCR test*, will test upon arrival and quarantine on the vessel they are travelling until a negative test result is received (turnaround time is generally less than 24 hours, though may take longer depending on arrival time). 2. Mariners with pre-arrival and on arrival test results will then test again on day 4, 8 and 14 if still in Bermuda. You will be booked into your test days and times. These will be emailed to you 24 hours before. 3. Monitor your health and record your temperature twice daily and any symptoms. 4. Wear a traveller wristband.

*A Mariner who does not have a valid COVID-19 PCR pre-arrival test result, must quarantine on the vessel they are travelling until receipt of a negative day 14 test result, inclusive of the time taken to arrive in Bermuda, on the vessel he/she is travelling on.

** Yachts with prior permission from Customs may be permitted to proceed to a marina to clear Customs and be assessed by Port Health.
