Information on Water Right Applications

Under the Water Resources Act 1975, no well or disposal borehole may be constructed or used in Bermuda without a valid Water Right granted by the Environmental Authority. The Environmental Authority has the power to revoke Water Rights or take other measures to regulate the use of ground water in the best interest of the community. The day to day administration of the Act is carried out by Officers of the Department of Environment & Natural Resources, Ministry of Health, Seniors & Environment, who report to the Environmental Authority.

A well or borehole should be sited no closer than 20 feet from a cesspit and no closer than 10 feet from a neighbour's boundary.

It is recommended that as a courtesy you notify your neighbour's before arranging for a drilling rig to move in to your property.

Only well drillers with a valid licence may be employed to construct boreholes and wells. Contact the Pollution Control Section of the Department of Environment & Natural Resources for a list of licensed drillers.

Well water may be used for flushing and can be suitable for other purposes such as washing. It should not, however, be used for drinking, as contaminants and harmful bacteria can be carried through the rock to your well. Untreated well water should **NEVER** be connected into a household tank and should **NEVER** be supplied to truckers.

Before any type of well or borehole is dug, application must be made for a Water Right. This can be done through the Pollution Control Section, Department of Environment & Natural Resources, Botanical Gardens, 169 South Road, Paget, DV-04 or to Department of Environment & Natural Resources, P.O. Box HM 834, Hamilton HM CX.

Please submit the completed form, together with the application fees per Domestic or Commerical Water Right as shown at the top of this form to the PO Box address above or to the Department of Environment & Natural Resources, Botanical Gardens, 169 South Road, Paget, DV-04. Cheques should be made payable to the **Accountant General**. Alternatively, payment may be made at the Cashiers, Ground Floor, Government Administration Building, 30 Parliament Street, Hamilton HM 12.

The guidelines for the distinction between a domestic and a commercial Water Right are as follows.

Domestic:

- (a) A well for supply of flushing/washing/pool water to a house or housing comprising 5 or fewer dwelling units:
- (b) A borehole for disposal of rain water.

Commercial:

- (a) A well for commercial public supply or for supply to 6 or more dwelling units, or to a restaurant, or to a large office block or to a guest house accommodating 6 or more paying guests, or to a trade, business, manufacturer or process which uses the water as part of its operation;
- (b) A borehole for the disposal of effluent other than rainwater.

Domestic and commercial applications will require consideration at a meeting of the Environmental Authority, which may involve a delay of up to three months.

All Water Rights are granted for a limited period (usually 5 years), after which time application for a Water Right must be repeated.

If you are proposing to treat well water with a desalination plant, such as by reverse osmosis, you must apply for a Water Right and separate application must be made for a licence issued by the Environmental Health Department.
