# The Bermuda Omnibus Survey© Second Quarter 2015

## Summary Report for Department of National Drug Control (DNDC)

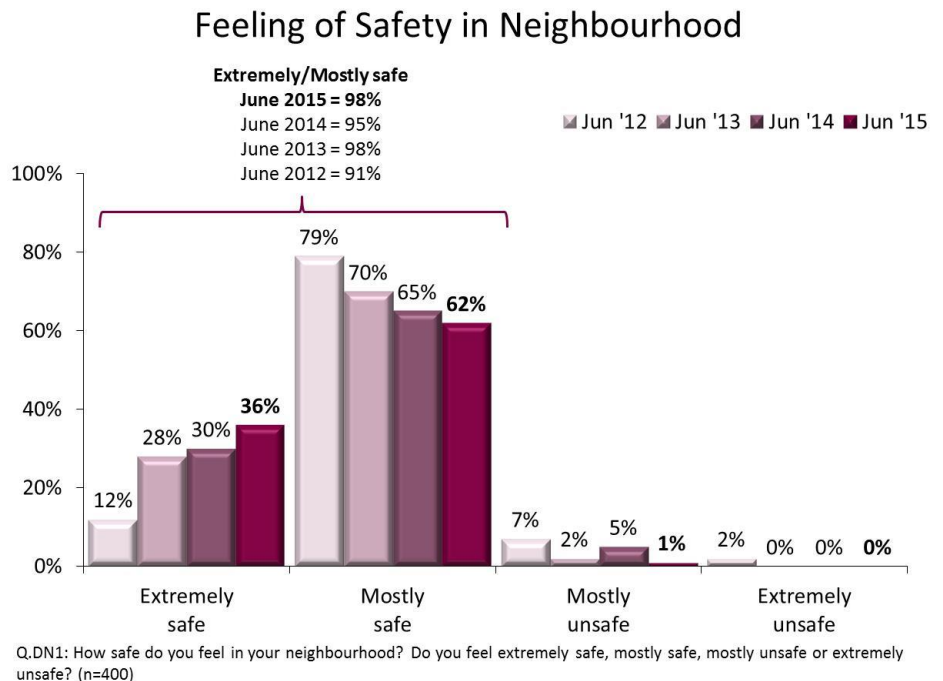
The following are commissioned results for the DNDC's commissioned questions from the latest Bermuda Omnibus Survey© a syndicated quarterly survey of Bermuda residents. The survey consisted of telephone interviews with a representative sample of 400 Bermuda residents conducted between June 19<sup>th</sup> and July 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2015. A sample of this size drawn from the population provides results accurate to within plus or minus 4.9 percent in 19 out of 20 samples.

### Safety in Neighbourhood

*Bermuda residents continue to feel increasingly safe in their neighbourhood.*

Concerns relating to crime have been a common issue for Bermuda residents over the past number of years. In order to assess feelings of personal safety, residents were asked how safe they felt in their own neighbourhood. Results show that nearly all residents feel either **extremely** (36% compared with 30% in June 2014) or **mostly** (62% compared with 65%) safe in their neighbourhood. Interestingly, the degree of feeling safe has increased compared to previous results, particularly among those who report feeling *extremely* safe which has improved notably since 2012. Few residents report feeling **unsafe** to any extent in their own neighbourhood (1% down from 5%) and no one reported feeling **extremely** unsafe in their neighbourhood.

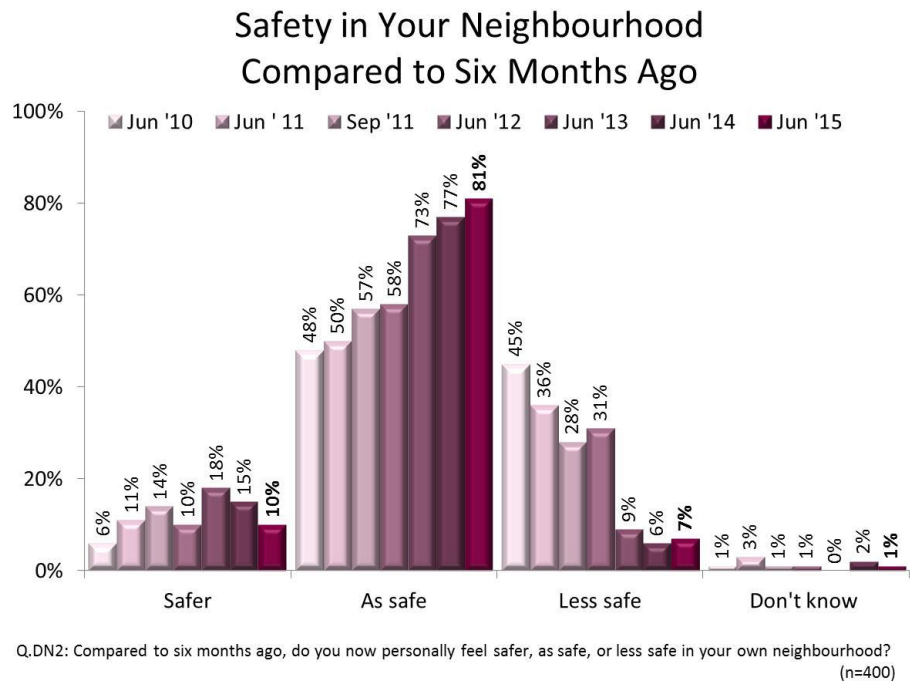
Of note, those with lower household incomes are more likely to report feeling **extremely safe** in their neighbourhood, compared with those who have higher household incomes. Across the region, residents of Hamilton/St. George's/ Smiths are most likely, and residents of Pembroke/ Devonshire are least likely, to indicate they feel **extremely safe** in their respective neighbourhoods. **Residents generally feel as safe or safer in their neighbourhood than they did six months ago.**

Residents were asked about their current feelings of safety in their neighbourhood compared to those from six months ago. The majority of Bermuda residents report feeling **as safe** (81%, compared with 77% in June 2014) as they were half a year ago, although slightly fewer feel **safer** (10%, down from 15%). Positively, few feel their neighbourhoods have become **less safe** (7%, compared with 6%), consistent with 2013 and 2014 results.

Of note, residents with annual household incomes below \$75K are more likely than their more affluent counterparts to feel safer. As well, black residents are more likely than white residents to believe they are safer than six months ago. (Table DN2)



**Crimes Committed in Neighbourhood**

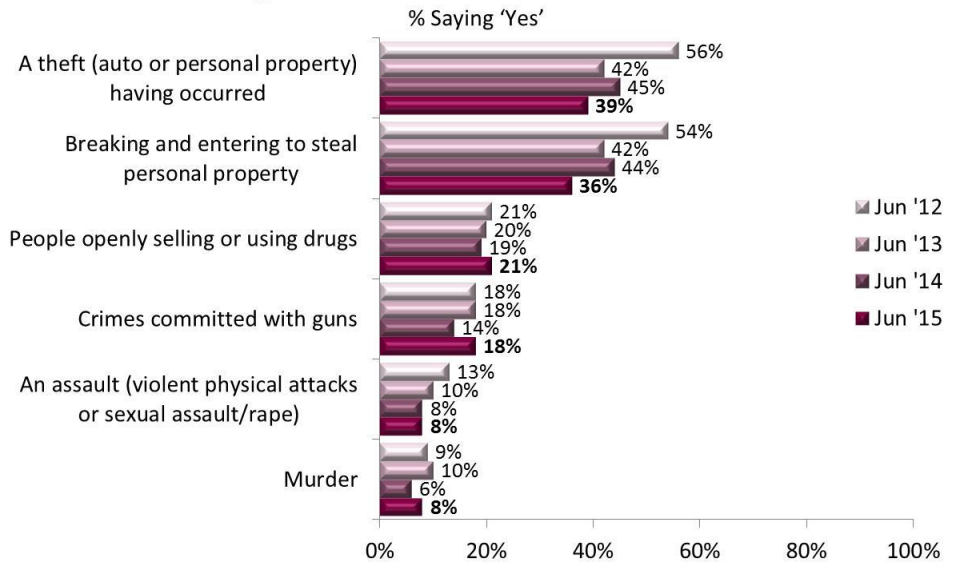
**Residents recall less theft and breaking and entering crimes in their neighbourhood this year.**

Residents were asked which types of crime have occurred in their neighbourhood in the past year. Consistent with previous findings, **theft** remains the most commonly noted crime, as four-in-ten residents (39%, compared with 45% in June 2014) are aware of cars or personal property being stolen, while a similar number (36%, down from 44%) are aware of **breaking and entering to steal personal property**, a decrease from one year ago. Drug-related or violent crime is recalled in relatively few neighbourhoods with two-in-ten being aware of **people openly selling or using drugs** (21%, compared with 19%), a similar number indicate having heard of **gun crimes** (18%, compared with 14%). Moreover, one-in-ten residents (8% unchanged) indicate that an **assault** had occurred in their neighbourhood in the past year, while the same number knew of a **murder** that happened in their neighbourhood within the past 12 months (8%, compared with 6%). Some differences are evident between parishes and demographics. Across parishes, residents of Sandys/Southampton are most likely, while residents of Hamilton/St. George's/ Smiths are least likely, to mention breaking and entering. Meanwhile, residents of Sandys/Southampton and Pembroke/Devonshire are more likely than residents of other parishes to recall higher levels of drug-related and gun crime as well as murder in their neighbourhood.

Across the population, those aged 18 to 34 years are more likely than their older counterparts to recall theft in their neighbourhood, while higher income earners and white residents are more likely to recall breaking and entering crime. Drug crime is more commonly recalled by those in the lowest income category and black residents, while men are more likely than women to recall gun crimes in their neighbourhood. Finally, recall of assault is more likely among older residents, while murder is more likely recalled among those in the lowest income category.

### Types of Crime Known to Have Occurred in Neighbourhood in Past 12 Months



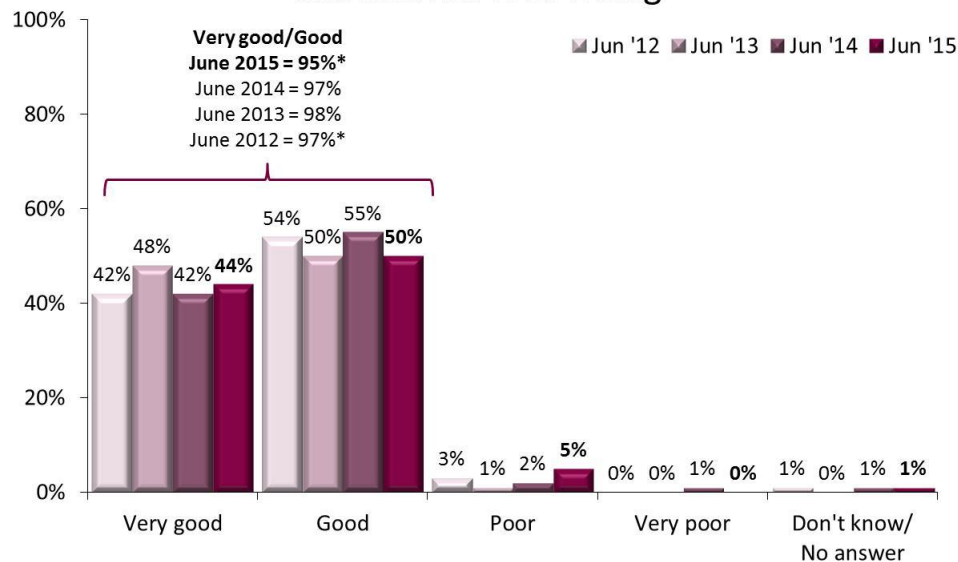
Q.DN3a-f: Which of the following types of crimes do you know to have occurred in your neighbourhood in the past 12 months? Do you know of: (n=400)

## Perception of Overall Health

**Most Bermuda residents perceive themselves to be in good health. Although very small, an increasing proportion believe they are in poor health.**

In order to measure perceptions of overall physical and mental well-being, respondents were asked how they would rate their own health. Virtually all residents consider themselves to be healthy (95%, compared with 97% in June 2014). More specifically, one-half indicate their health is **good** (50%, compared with 55%), while over four-in-ten residents describe their health as being **very good** (44%, compared with 42%). Meanwhile, a small but increasing proportion of the population, (5%, up from 2%), indicate their health is **poor**, while no residents give an answer of **very poor**. (Table DN4)

Ratings of personal health vary by demographics with lower income households offering poorer ratings of health than those with higher household incomes. In addition, black residents are more likely to offer poorer ratings of personal health than white residents.
